- A. As part of the FY2016 HUD CoC NOFA competition released 6/29/16, any **ELIGIBLE APPLICANT** may submit a Letter of Intent to VSHA for a NEW (Permanent Housing Bonus or Reallocated Project from Existing CoC funds) and/or RENEWAL CoC Projects.
- B. The **RANKING TEAM** will use the CoC-approved Policy & Tool, along with HUD CoC NOFA thresholds and guidance, to make funding determinations and rank approved projects to be submitted to HUD for consideration.
- C. **APPEALS PROCESS**: Any CoC project applicant may send a written response to the Ranking Committee if there is an objection to the project determination (denied/reduced funding, lower priority, or other reason). Solo Applicants may also submit an appeal directly to HUD as described in the Timeline above and the FY2016 CoC NOFA.
