Treasurer's Report to VCEH Membership

6/17/2014

First of all, let me say thank you to the Coalition for all the support you've provided since I took over the Treasurer's duties from Amy back in April of this year. It takes a little while to get one's sea legs, but I think it's moving along.

As I poured over the materials left by former Treasurers and went through the invoices and purchase orders, a couple of things occurred to me that I thought might be very valuable for the Coalition to discuss as we move forward into the next year.

Let me please stress, that although I spoke with a few colleagues about my observations, they are just that: observations; some things for the group to think and talk about.

Attached to this report are four documents:

- 2013-14 Invoices and Dues Paid as of 6/16/14 which shows that we hoped to bring in \$2,400 and we've brought in \$1,990 so far. There may be a couple of outstanding invoices in my Finance Department that haven't made it into their bi-weekly report, but it is accurate as of 6/16/14.
- 2013-14 Revenue and Expenses illustrates the carry-over and dues and where we spent our dues.
- 2013-14 Budget and Actuals is a picture of how we thought we would bring in funds and make expenditures and where we actually did.
- 2014-15 Budget is a VERY Preliminary Budget for Discussion

The first topic is "Stipends". Two things jump out at me; one is that the Standing Rules state that, "no part of the assets or income of the Coalition may be distributed for the financial benefits of the officers, members, or volunteers" (Article II: Membership). Under eligible expenses, it states: "Consumer assistance for eligible conferences or trainings; a stipend for travel and training. Local continuum support of 50% of the request is expected." We have been paying stipends to a consumer representative for attendance at meetings and toward a portion of the Americorps-VISTA position, but it appears to be in contradiction to the guidance of the Standing Rules.

Two is the actual cost of the stipends. Bearing in mind how appreciative we are of our members' contributions we are, we were able to cover that cost this year because we had a considerable carry-over of funds from last year. In all actuality, we spent \$2,850 on stipends, while only bringing in \$1,990 in dues.

If the Coalition decides to approach the topic there are a few ways we might do that:

- 1. We could amend the Standing Rules to reflect our current practice which I would recommend should the Coalition want to continue offering stipends.
- 2. We could discuss how to fund those stipends should we move forward by
 - a. Raising dues
 - b. Lowering the amounts of the stipends and/or our third of the Americorps position
 - c. Lowering the numbers of meetings covered by stipend.
- 3. What other ideas or solutions are there?

The second area that seemed to me to be worthy of discussion is Article II, Section 2: Dues. Currently, our system is loosely set up to be dues of \$150 from each of the 10 local continua, and \$150 in dues from a variety of generous Partner Coalitions (see the Invoice sheet). We may want to continue with the status quo, with each local continuum deciding how best to fundraise.

However, if we want to continue with stipends or expand our activities, we may also want to talk about how to increase our revenue. For example (and I have no specific recommendation), we could

- 1. Increase the amount of dues (for example, increasing by \$50 would bring current expected revenues from \$2,400 to \$3,200), or
- 2. Increase the number of Partner Coalitions. Possible additions may be VCRHYP, Department of Corrections, Pathways, our regional Community Mental Health Agencies, Veteran's Administration of other veteran-serving organizations, or the Department of Education.
- 3. What other ideas or solutions might there be?

What are your thoughts?

In conclusion, discussions about money can be difficult, but they are vital to the work. Let me thank you once again for allowing me to play a small role in the amazing and invaluable work this Coalition does.
