- 7) Legislative Update Erhard Mahnke



- a) State legislative update
  - i) Cold weather exemption sign-on letter and request for reinstatement of 2.5 million
    - (1) Will be sending to Senate appropriations today
    - (2) Erhard encouraging agencies/local CoCs to sign-on
    - (3) Requesting vote from VCEH to sign-on
      - (a) Senate appropriations looks "poised" to reinstate cold-weather exemption and some of the AHS funds
      - (b) Senator proposing additional funds to Rutland and Washington counties (utilized a high amount of hotels)
    - (4) Conversation re: who would be in conference meeting for appropriations (still to be determined, chairs will be in attendance)
  - ii) VHCB funding request for increase
  - iii) S135 bill housing provisions bill that makes it "easier" to build mixed-income housing.
    - (1) Likely finalized in house this week
    - (2) Hope to see return of \$35 million revenue bond
  - iv) Occupancy Fee
    - (1) Appears to be "dead" at this point
    - (2) Opposition from business community/governor was strong
- b) Federal legislative update
  - i) Erhard in D.C. for visits
  - ii) Visit focused on budget and appropriations
  - iii) No FY17 appropriations act yet
  - iv) Continuing resolution expires 4/28
  - v) Concerns that "wall" will be included
- c) FY18 budget proposal from administration is "dead on arrival"
  - i) If even "portion is enacted" would be "devastating"
  - ii) Concerns re: budget control caps
  - iii) Senate needs 60 votes to pass appropriations bill
