Youth Engagement Action Plan - Focus Groups

Goal: To uncover youth's preferences and needs around housing resources and services.

Method: Focus Groups

- Participants: 16-26 year olds who have (or may) experience a housing crisis or instability
 - o Targeted populations: LGBTQ, pregnant/parenting, POC, recovery, rural
- Targeted outreach: BCP, TLP, YDP, JJ, teen centers, youth boards, Outright, Multicultural Youth Program, Parent Child Centers, Turning Point, Woodside, Root, Reach Up
- Staffing: One facilitator, and one note-taker
- Locations: Burlington, St. Johnsbury, Rutland, Brattleboro
- Meeting space: Community/teen centers, conference rooms at local agencies
- Timing: 1.5 hour
- Group size: 6-8 youth

Meeting Agenda:

- Welcome/Introductions and pronouns (2 min)
- Getting to know you game (5 min)
- Outline of process and "rules" (2 min)
- Questions/dialogue (70 min)
- Priorities rating activity (10 min)
- Closing and stipends (1 min)

Questions: (Activation, Investigation, Conclusion)

- 1. Who would you feel comfortable going to for help if you don't know where you're sleeping that night?
- 2. How do people usually learn about services and programs? Are there any other places you think it would be helpful to have that information?
- 3. What are things that make it hard for you or your peers to get help?
- 4. What skills and supports do young adults need to live independently?
- 5. What do you think homeless teens and young adults need? What would help them get that?
- 6. And how do you think service providers view teens and young adults? How does that opinion affect your desire to access resources?
- 7. When you've gotten help from services/programs/groups, what have you found to be the most helpful/make the most difference for you?
- 8. What do you notice when someone who's supporting you values your personal goals and beliefs?
- 9. Priorities rating and discussion
- 10. If you had three wishes that you could use to make your community better, what would you wish for?
- 11. Are there any topics you think we missed or questions you have for us?

Priorities Rating Activity:

- Each participant will get an envelope filled with words that represent priorities. They will have a couple minutes to quietly rank the priorities for themselves from most to least important. We will then spend a few minutes discussing their rankings. The note-taker will take photos of everyone's list so we can catalogue priorities from each group.
- Prompt Question: In this envelope are words for things that help support independent living. Rate them from what you think are most important and you need the most help with.
- Discussion questions:
 - O Why did you rank things the way you did?
 - O Have there been times in your life when your list would have looked different?
 - O If some of these priorities were a given that you didn't even need to think about, what would you want to focus on the most?
- Priorities list ranking: What do you think is important for you to get support with to get or maintain your own place (use three categories: essential, helpful, unnecessary)
 - **o** grocery shopping
 - o cooking
 - o budgeting my money
 - o getting or keeping a job
 - o school (high school, graduation, etc.)
 - O higher ed (college, trade programs, etc.)
 - o relationships with my family
 - o relationships with my partner
 - o relationships with friends
 - o relationships with other adults who support me
 - o mental health support
 - o physical health support
 - o being able to call in sick to work (good relationship with my boss and coworkers)
 - o thinking about my life and where I want it to go
 - o setting boundaries to
 - o having a job that pays a livable wage
 - o support taking care of a child
 - o transportation- rides or my own car
 - o a safe person to reach out to
 - o access to a phone/ computer/ wifi
 - o other:
