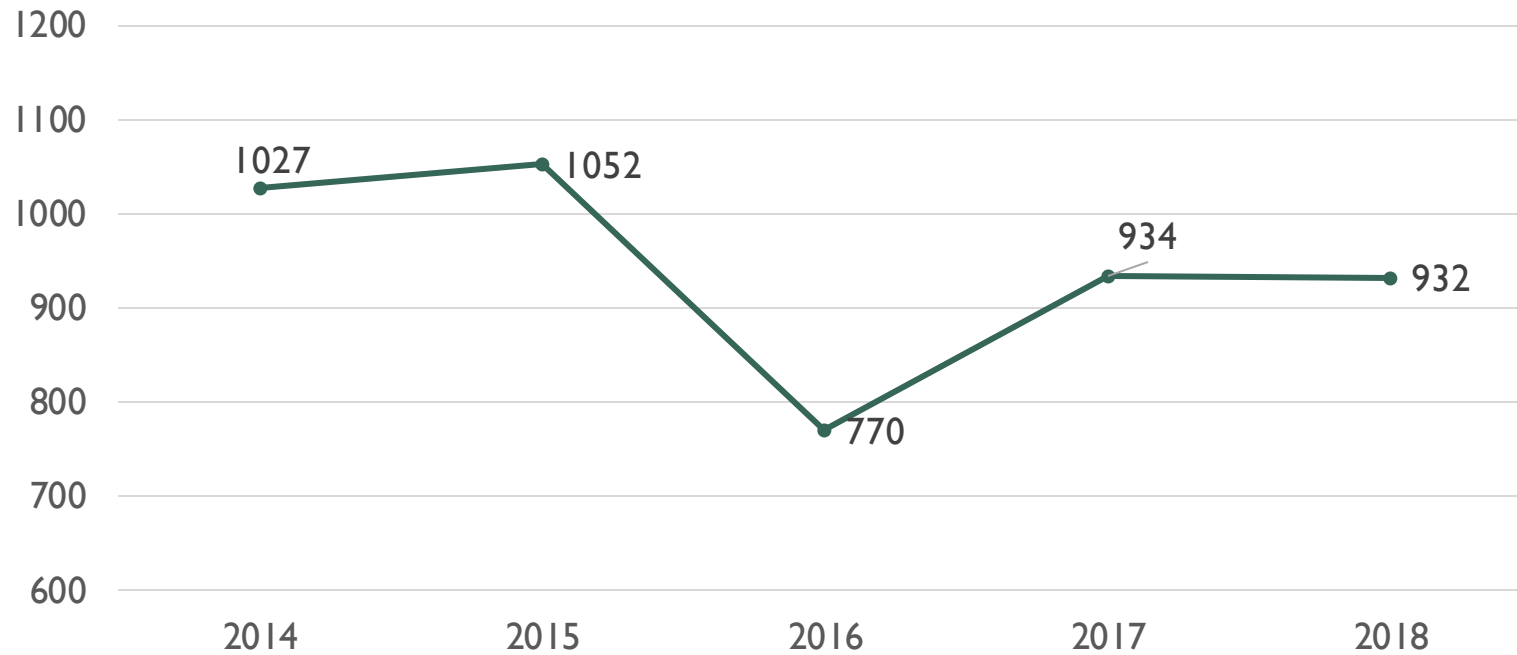
SETTING THE CONTEXT

- The Point in Time Count includes all people “literally homeless” by HUD’s definition: *Individuals and families who live in a place not meant for human habitation (including the streets or in their car), emergency shelter, transitional housing, and hotels paid for by a government or charitable organization*
- The Balance of State geography includes all Vermont counties *except for Chittenden County*
- This presentation includes DRAFT data; final data will be out at the end of April and may include slight changes

BALANCE OF STATE 2018 NUMBERS

TOTAL: 932 persons, 634 households

THE DEMOGRAPHIC PICTURE

GENDER IDENTITY: 54% (506) male; 45% (423) female; <1% (2) transgender; <1% (1) gender non-conforming

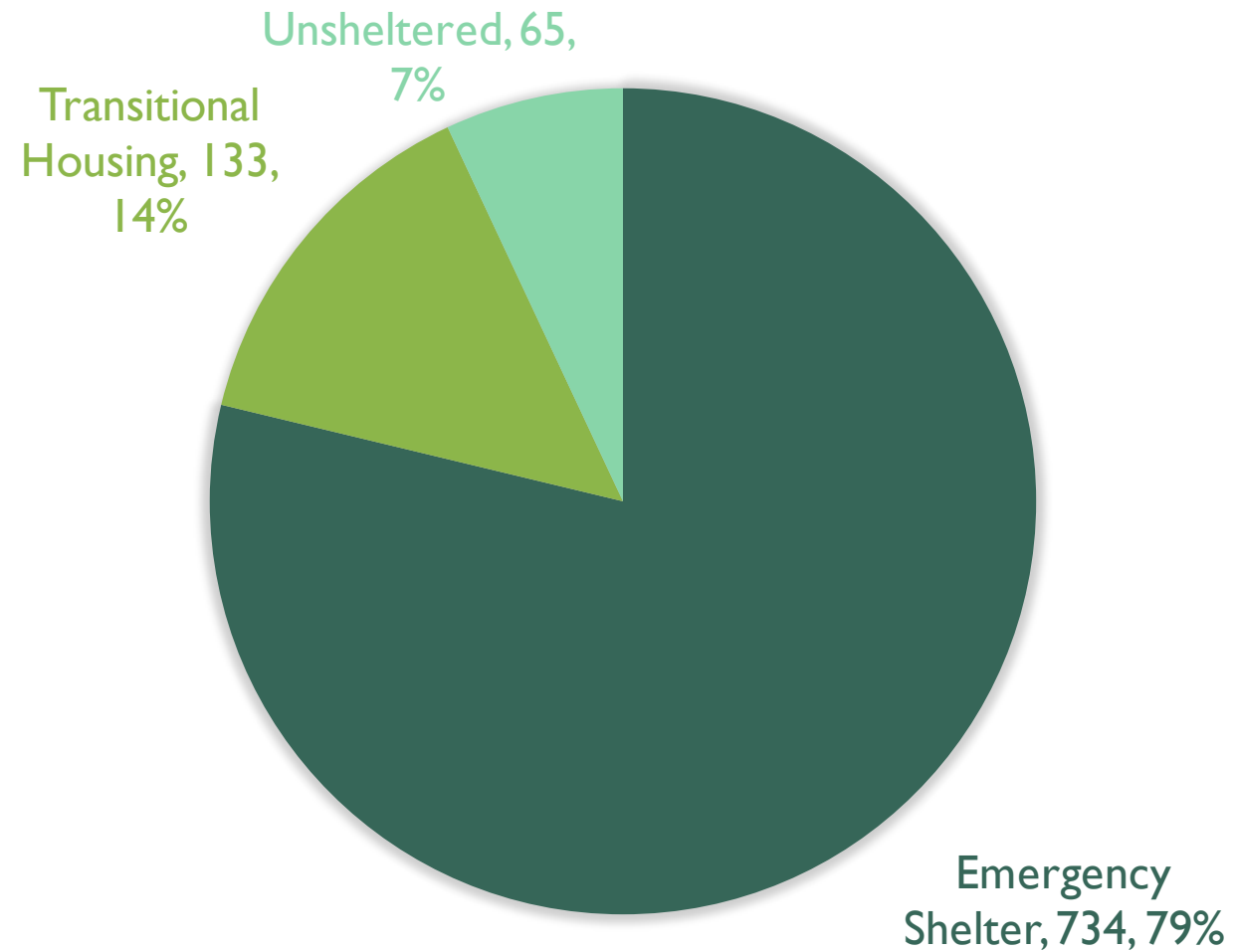
AGE: 63% (590) adults; 25% (236) children under 18*; 12% (108) young adults aged 18-24*

RACE: 92% (857) White, 3% (32) Multiple Races, 3% (31) Black, 1% (9) American Indian or Alaska Native, <1% (3) Asian

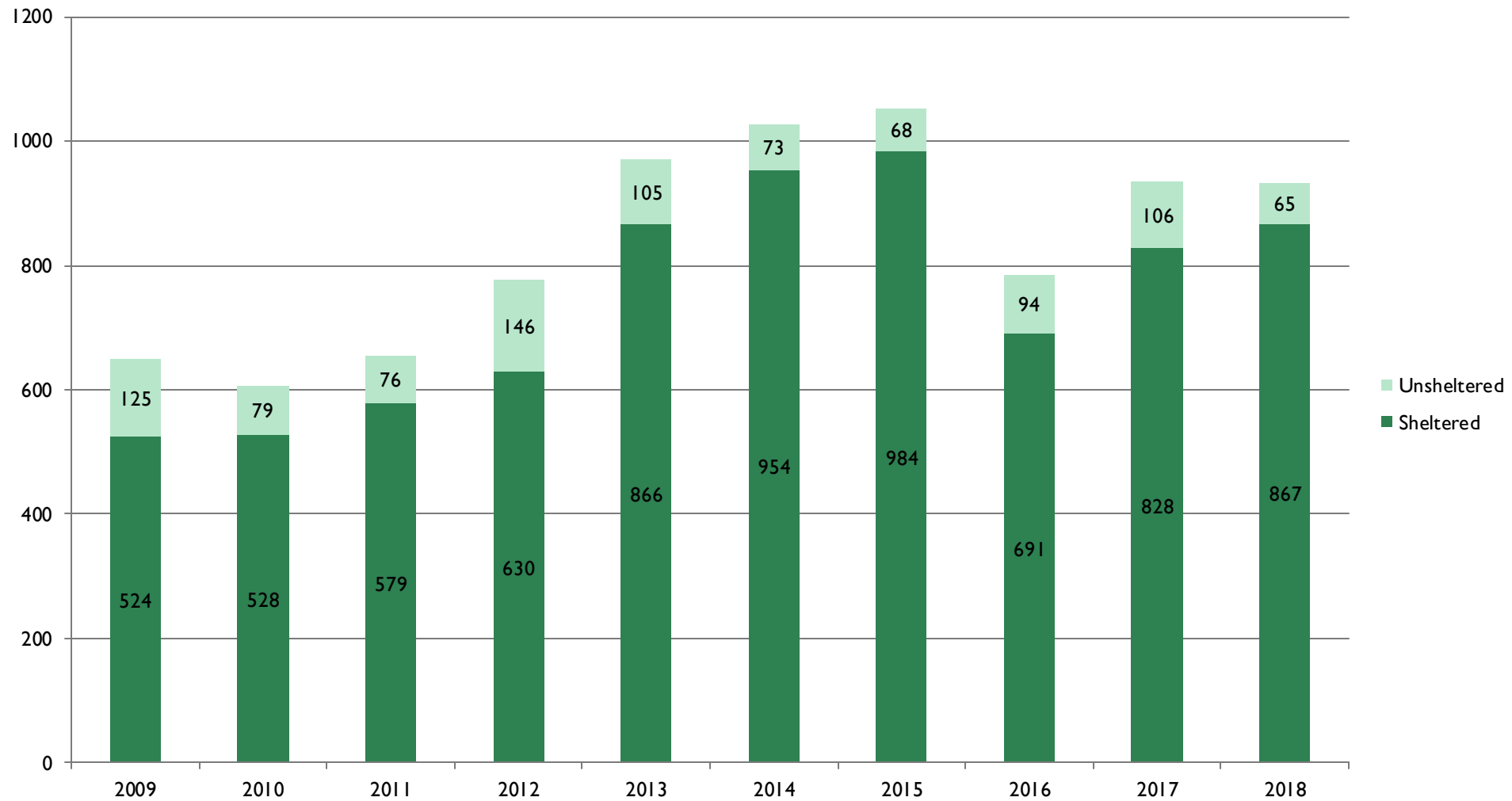
ETHNICITY: 5% (51) Hispanic or Latino

* An additional 251 youth were identified as precariously housed (including 50 unaccompanied youth). 212 were preschool age to 18 and 39 were between 19-23 years old.

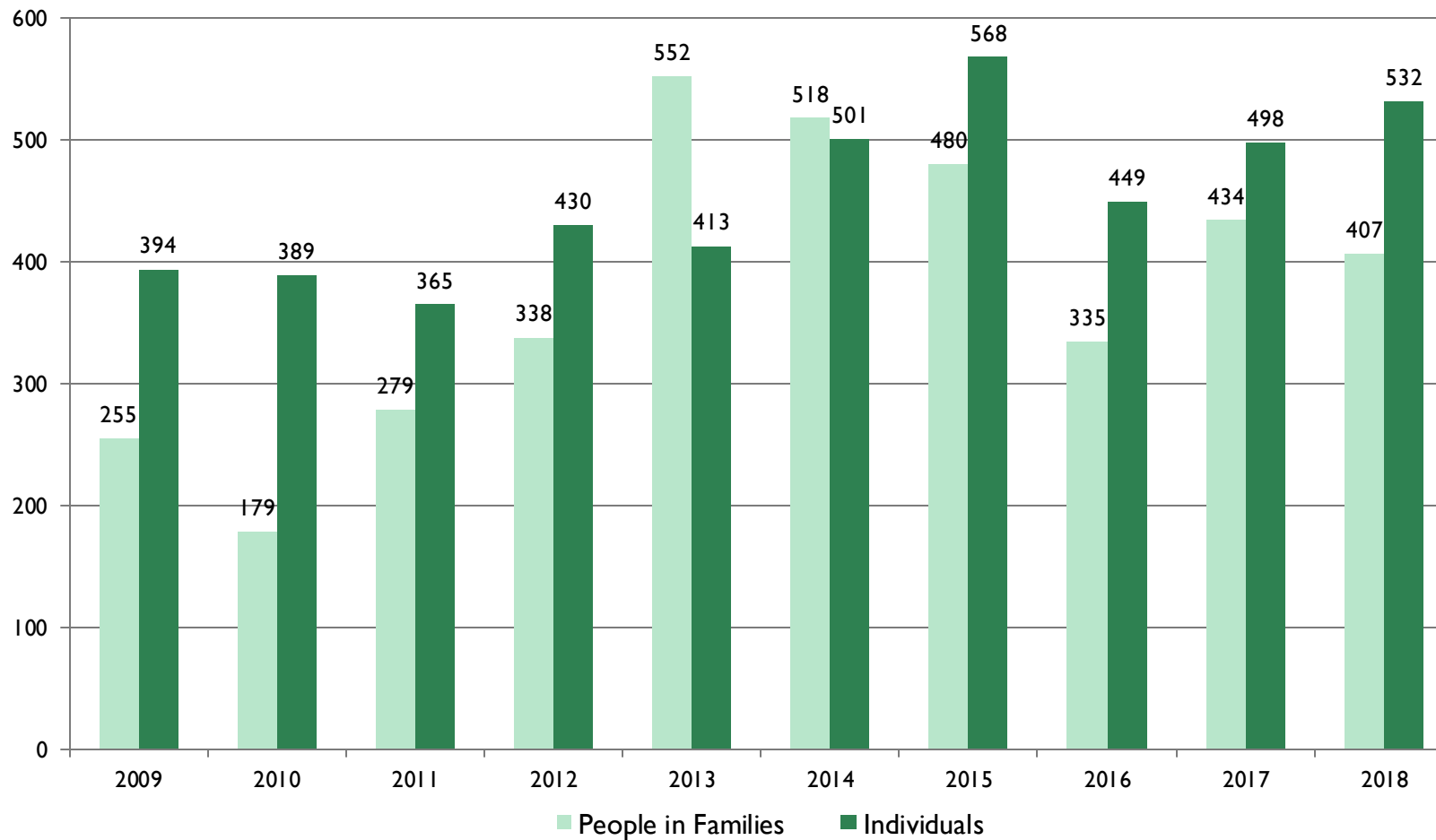
LOCATIONS OF HOMELESSNESS



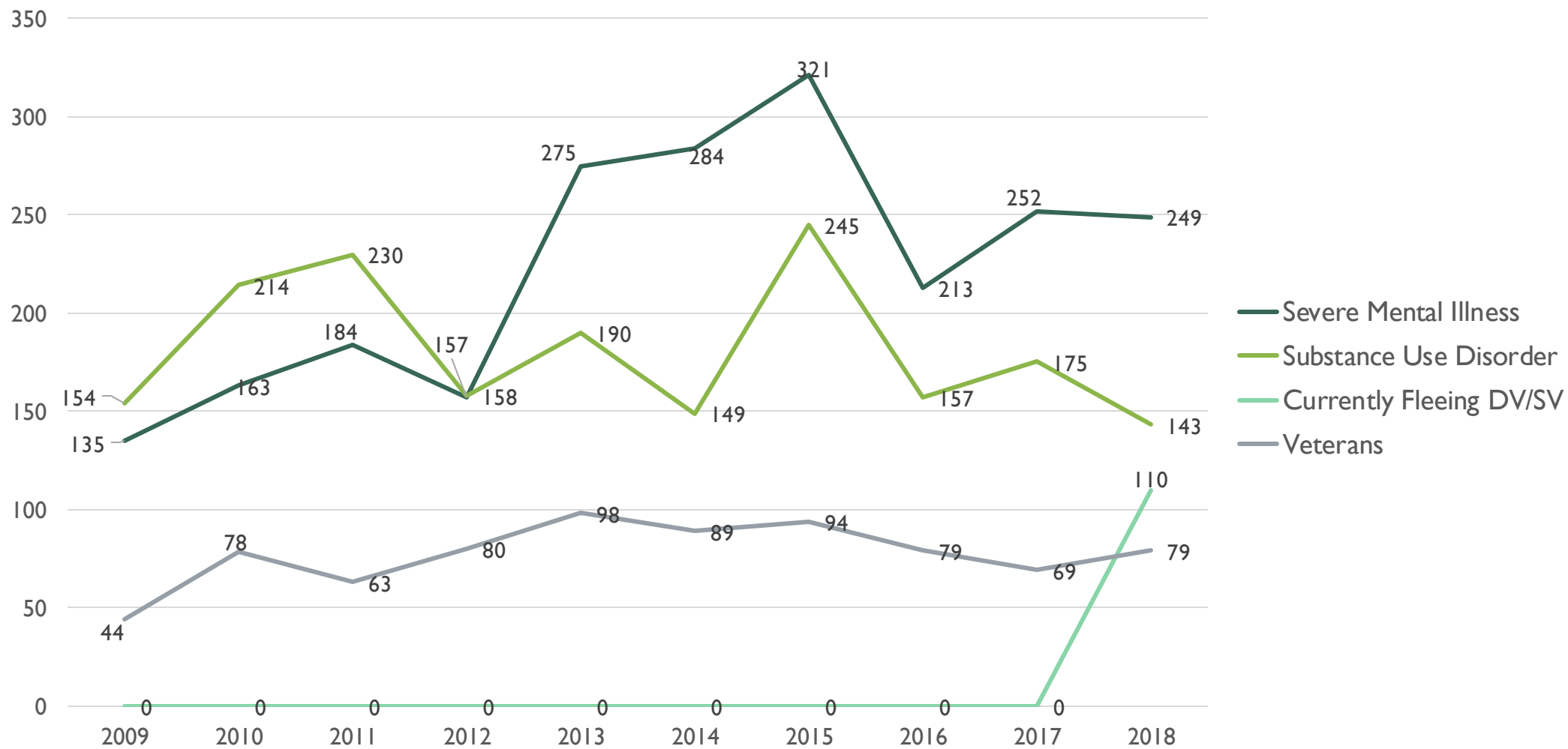
HOMELESS POPULATION BY SHELTERED VS. UNSHELTERED
