Vermont Balance of State Continuum of Care (CoC) & Chittenden County Continuum of Care (CoC)

Vermont has two HUD-recognized Continua of Care (CoC) that coordinate a response to homelessness and apply for federal homeless funding for their corresponding geographic areas.

Within the Balance of State Continuum of Care, each region in Vermont has a local housing coalition focused on regional response to homelessness.

- Covers all VT except Chittenden County
- VT BoS CoC Board is the governing body
- Housing & Homelessness Alliance of Vermont (HHAV) is the Collaborative Applicant for HUD CoC Programs & Grant Application (NOFO) and provides staffing
